1 Sergeant Butera then led me to the area of 160 N Joy St. He told me that he saw Selvin 2 running north/west from the general area of 160 N Joy St, adding that this was where Selvin was 3 when he (Sergeant Butera) first saw him. 4 5 We then walked over to 91 E Grand Blvd which is where Sergeant Butera said that the 6 initial officers first saw Selvin. As we checked the parking lot area, I found what appeared to be 7 fresh footprints in the mud of the planter on the north/west side of 91 E Grand Blvd. It appeared 8 that at least one (1) of the footprints was facing in a southerly direction and one (1) was facing 9 northerly. | also saw dried/muddy footprints heading eastbound on the asphalt between 91 and 95 10 E Grand Blvd. The footprints led to a wall separating 91 E Grand Blvd and the secured vard at 160 11 N Joy St. About half way up the wall was a scuff mark, with dirt. This scuff mark was in a location 12 consistent with the suspect kicking the wall as he jumped over it-see Forensic Tech Walker's 13 report for further. 14 15 I telephoned Corona Police Officer Perez and asked him where the suspect was when he 16 (Officer Perez) first saw him. He told me he saw the suspect next to a vehicle in the parking lot of 17 91 E Grand Blvd (the vehicle was later determined to be VM red Honda 18 Accord, CA license). He said the suspect then ran north/east between 91 and 95 E 19 Grand Blvd and out of sight-consistent with the footprints found at the scene. I had Officer Bell 20 mark the suspect's path of travel with orange spray chalk. 21 22 After we had walked the scene, I determined that we would process the railroad tracks first 23 and come back to 91 E Grand Blvd (due to all tracks being closed). Detective Gonzalez, Corporal 24 Kazsuk, and Officers Gonzalez, Neff and Tran responded to the 100 block of N Joy St and took 25 over scene security for 91 E Grand and 160 N. Joy St. Detective Gonzalez also received consent 26 to search the secured yard at 160 N Joy St-see his report for details. Yellow crime scene tape 27 was placed around the scene at 91 E Grand Blvd, eastbound railroad tracks at N Joy St and the 28 access road from Pearl St to assist with scene security. 29

1	Once the Grand/Joy scene security was in place, approximately 1030 hours, the listed
2	personnel and I conducted a systematic search of the railroad tracks from Joy St to the interior
3	crime scene. No evidence was located. We also assisted Detective Jurado with a search to locate
4	the casing—see Detective Jurado's report for further details on the casing.
5	
6	After our search of the tracks was complete, approximately 1225 hours, Forensic Tech
7	Walker and I relocated from the Command Post at 1235 Quarry St to the 100 block of N Joy St.
8	Forensic Tech Walker then photographed the tracks and the areas marked with the spray chalk.
9	As she photographed the scene, Corona Police Traffic Personnel were on scene to plot a factual
10	diagram-refer to Officer Samano's report for details of the factual diagram. At approximately
11	1320 hours, the railroad tracks were opened, with the assistance of BNSF personnel escorts, as
12	traffic personnel were still on scene.
13	
14	Forensic Tech Walker and I went to 105 E Frontage St to photograph the area where
15	Senior Detective R Avila's vehicle was parked. We then went to where Forensic
16	Tech Walker photographed and documented the mentioned footprints. As we processed this area,
17	Detective Vega and Officer Bell searched the secured lot at 160 N Joy St for evidence, but no
18	evidence was located.
19	
20	While at Detective Sergeant Edwards called me and asked that I process
21	VM vehicle due to the suspect attempting to carjack her—see Officer L
22	Larios' report for details. I contacted and told her that we would like to photograph and take
23	DNA evidence from her vehicle. voluntarily agreed and signed the attached Consent to
24	Search form. asked about the points of contact that the suspect had with her vehicle.
25	She told me the suspect only touched her driver's door. Forensic Tech Walker photographed the
26	vehicle and processed the exterior of the vehicle for evidence-see her report for details. I also
27	asked if she would be willing to give a voluntary DNA reference sample. She said she
28	would and I collected a buccal swab sample from her (item DB01).

On August 30, 2012, at about 0725 hours I responded to the 90 block of east Grand Blvd to assist Corona Police Units with a search of a subject seen walking the area covered in blood.

While on my way to the area, assisting personnel broadcasted over the radio that the suspect who was later identified as **(SU01) Selvin Rodriguez** was last seen entering a business complex just east of the Metro Link parking lot located on east Grand Blvd. Suspecting the suspect would emerge on the north east side of the businesses complex I drove onto northbound Joy Street from Grand Blvd. As I approached the railroad tracks I saw the suspect running at a full stride eastbound, north of the tracks with several officers running a few yards behind him. Seeing that the suspect appeared to be out running the officers, I drove onto the railroad grabble between the center and the south tracks in an attempt to catch the suspect.

I was in my unmarked police detective unit, grey Nissan Pathfinder, unit #71133. The unit is outfitted with siren, a red light to the front and yellow and blue lights to the rear, all of which are operational and active during my chase.

As I passed the officers and approached the suspect, I turned my wheels to the left in an attempt to intercept the suspect. Because the maneuver was done over raised metal railroad tracks, my vehicle became disabled after high centering over the tracks.

As I dealt with my vehicle that became stuck, the suspect continued to flee eastbound resulting in an OIS a short time later. (Refer to initial police report for further details)

On 08-30-12, about 0720 hrs, I was at the Riverside Police Dept.'s Magnolia station, to pick up Riverside Police Officer Matt Parish. As Officer Parish was loading his equipment into my police vehicle, he informed me that Riverside Officers were responding to a radio call of a stabbing. Officer Parish further told me the suspect had just stabbed two children and one adult and fled the scene. After a few minutes, we were advised the suspect was a Hispanic male in his 20's and driving a green Toyota Rav-4.

I sent a BOLO message to all Corona Police cars via, the computer and provided the above listed suspect info. A few minutes later, I heard Corona Police Dispatch advising officers, that a citizen was reporting a Hispanic male subject walking near the 91 freeway at Main St. wearing bloody clothing and carrying a knife in his back pocket. Police Dispatch further advised the male subject had abandoned a green Toyota Rav-4 on the 91 freeway near interstate 15.

17

Moments later, I heard Corona Police Officers advise they were in foot pursuit of the suspect and an officer involved shooting had just occurred. I responded to the shooting scene and I assisted with preserving the scene and established a secure area for investigators.

Details: On 08-30-12 I was on duty as a Police Sergeant for the City of Corona, 1 2 in the County of Riverside, State of California. I was wearing a standard class B 3 police uniform, driving a marked black and white Corona Police Car. I responded to the area of Main St. and the 91 Freeway; reference a suspicious male with a 4 butcher knife who was covered in blood walking on the freeway. 5 While responding, Corona PD Dispatch advised the male was possibly related to an 6 assault with deadly weapon incident that had just occurred in the neighboring 7 City of Riverside. On arrival, numerous other Corona Police Officers were 8 checking the immediate area of the freeway and off ramp. The initial reporting 9 person did not maintain visual of the person, and had left the area. It was 10 uncertain of the male's whereabouts. 11

An officer advised over the radio that the male was located running on E. Grand 13 Blvd by the 91 Freeway. I responded to the location, as one of the officers 14 advised over the radio the male had run N/B between 91 and 95 E. Grand Blvd. I 15 saw a Motor Officer pointing E/B, and believed he was signaling that the male 16 was jumping the fences toward Joy St. I continued on E. Grand Blvd. and made 17 a left turn onto the 100 Blk. of N. Joy St. I immediately saw a male Hispanic 18 running from the area of the industrial buildings located on the west side of Joy 19 St. The male was running in a N/E diagonal direction, crossing the roadway 20 toward the rail road tracks. I saw, from a distance of approximately one football 21 field or 400' away, that the male was wearing a dirty white shirt and jeans. This 22 description differed slightly from a black shirt initially reported, then an updated 23 description of a tan shirt that the suspect was wearing. As I rapidly drove closer, 24 I clearly saw that the male had a large knife held by the handle in his left hand. 25 The knife appeared to be a large 8-9 inch blade knife that someone would 26 usually use in a kitchen, possibly kept in a wooden block on a counter. It clearly 27 was not a fixed blade knife that someone would keep in a sheath on their belt, or 28 a pocket knife. The male continued running E/B along the railroad tracks. Despite 29 the difference in shirt color described, I firmly believed this was the ADW suspect 30 based on his fleeing actions and the knife he was carrying. 31

I advised over the radio the suspect's location and that I would be pursuing him on foot. I also requested police units to nearby Pearl St, which dead ends alongside the tracks ahead of our location. As I exited my police car at Joy St. and the tracks, I saw the suspect was approximately 50 yards ahead and still running. I yelled in his direction," Police, Stop." I did not see him look back and do not know if he heard me. I could hear numerous sirens in the area from assisting officers responding to the area.

Approximately 1000 feet from Joy St, the suspect began to slow along the northern side railway tracks and walk as if he was becoming exhausted. The rocky ground alongside, and within the railroad tracks, was much more difficult to run on than a flat solid surface. Due to this I had been unable to close the gap on the suspect. At that time an unmarked Corona Police Detective unit (dark colored Nissan Pathfinder) came traveling rapidly alongside the southern railway tracks.

There are three sets of parallel tracks in this area. The unmarked unit had an audible siren on, as well as flashing red and blue strobe lights pointing forward. Upon seeing this, the suspect began running again. The unit attempted to traverse the tracks and intercept the suspect, but became stuck. I continued to run after the suspect. The suspect ran past a Detective and a Motor Officer on the opposite side of a tall chain link fence. They were yelling at the suspect to stop but he continued to run.

9 Detective Sears drove along the railroad tracks, E/B from Joy St. Detective 10 Sears came to a stop, and Corporal Waldon and I boarded his vehicle. Corporal 11 Waldon had come from behind me, and I did not know when or where he entered 12 the foot pursuit. Detective Sears drove alongside the tracks, until he came up 13 behind a train and could go no further. Corporal Waldon, Detective Sears, 14 Detective Voorhees, Officer L. Shatford, and myself exited the vehicle and 15 continued pursuing the suspect on foot.

16

The suspect continued running E/B within the middle railroad track. There was a 17 stopped freight train on the south track immediately to our right. There were no 18 trains approaching on either the middle or northern track. Detective Sears, 19 Officer Shatford, and Corporal Waldon were approximately 30 feet ahead of me, 20 and 50-75 feet behind the suspect. The suspect still had the large knife in his left 21 hand as he ran. There were verbal orders given to the suspect by them several 22 times. While beneath the overpass, I saw Corporal Waldon go to the ground in a 23 prone position with his AR-15 pointed in the direction of the suspect. One 24 gunshot rang out from Corporal Waldon's AR-15. I saw the suspect instantly fall 25 forward. The suspect landed on his stomach, face down on the railroad ties 26 within the railroad tracks. His head was pointed east, and his body was 27 outstretched with his feet pointing west. Dispatch was immediately advised via 28 radio that an 'OIS' had occurred. 29

Myself and the Officers approached the suspect to take him into custody, make a 31 safe scene, and render medical aid. As we walked the 50-75 feet up to the 32 suspect, I could see his left arm and hand somewhat outstretched above his 33 head. The knife was on the ground (railroad ties) within 6 inches of his hand. I 34 could see for the first time that the knife had a large amount of what appeared to 35 be blood smeared on the blade. The suspect, who was conscious with his eyes 36 open, was given verbal commands to take his hand away from the knife. I could 37 see that the suspect had one fresh blood spot the size of a 50 cent piece in the 38 area of his right upper back. I believed this to be the area he was shot by 39 Corporal Waldon. 40

The suspect did not remove his hand from the area of the knife, but did start to slowly roll onto his right side. Officers M. Samano and L. Shatford grabbed the suspect by his ankles and dragged him back approximately five feet away from the knife. The suspect was taken into custody and a search of his person for further weapons was conducted.

At that time I communicated with Dispatch reference best access to the area for 1 medical aid. I assigned Officer J. Perez to go with Corporal Waldon back to the 2 Police Station. I also began coordinating with Officers for preservation of the 3 shooting scene. Approximately 2-3 minutes after the suspect had been taken 4 into custody, Officers L. Shatford and M. Samano advised the suspect had 5 6 become non- responsive and they would be administering CPR. I requested Corporal Stofila to take some photographs of the scene, the suspect's position, 7 the knife and its position, and of the Officers performing CPR. This was done due 8 to a nearby moving train, and the possibility of another train coming through the 9 area causing us to move. CFD and AMR arrived on scene and transported the 10 suspect to the hospital for further medical treatment. Officers L. Shatford and M. 11 Samano also went with the suspect to the hospital. Shortly after, Dispatch 12 advised they had final confirmation from Santa FE that no trains would be coming 13 through the area. 14

The Corona Police OIS Team responded to the location. I briefed the team, 16 headed by Lt. Johnson and Lt. Lorton, of what had occurred to the best of my 17 knowledge. The OIS Team assumed control of the incident and scene. 18

1 DETAILS:

2 On 08-30-2012 at 0731 hours, I heard Officers responding to a call of a 3 suspicious person on the 91 Freeway at Main St., Corona. Dispatch stated a 4 caller advised there was a male who exited a green Toyota Rav 4 who had blood 5 on him and was in the possession of a butcher knife. A few moments prior, 6 Officer Hubbard sent out a broadcast reference an assault with a deadly 7 weapon/stabbing in Riverside and the male suspect fled in a green Toyota Rav 4. 8 9 Based on the information provided, I formed the opinion that the 10 suspicious male and the stabbing suspect were one in the same. I responded to 11 the area as Officers began searching for the suspect. I heard Officer Perez state

over the radio that he needed officer's to stop a vehicle that the suspect tried to
get into. As I neared the area of Joy and E. Grand, I heard Sergeant Butera
state on the radio that the suspect was running eastbound on the railroad tracks
from Joy St.

As I drove northbound on Joy St, I saw Sergeant Butera running eastbound. I exited my patrol car and began running eastbound. I quickly saw a male with dark hair, wearing a white shirt with a design on the back. The male suspect was running and at times looked back toward Sergeant Butera and I.

As Sergeant Butera and I ran after the suspect, I yelled for him to stop and drop the knife. The male continued running eastbound. As I ran eastbound, I saw Corporal Waldon run up next to me. Detective Sears and Detective Voorhees pulled up in an unmarked unit and Sergeant Butera, Corporal Waldon and I got inside. Detective Sears drove us eastbound until the rock/railroad shoulder ended. From my vantage point in the back seat, I was able to maintain visual contact with the male suspect.

1 Corporal Waldon, Detective Voorhees, Detective Sears and I exited and 2 continued to run after the suspect. The male suspect was approximately 70 to 3 100 yards away and again, I yelled for him to stop and drop the knife. I feared 4 that if the suspect was to get away or out of sight he may try to hurt or kill anyone 5 with whom he came in contact.

As I was running, I saw Corporal Waldon lay down in a "prone" position with his rifle. Based on my training, I knew Corporal Waldon was preparing to stop the suspect from hurting anyone or fleeing. I yelled for the other Officers to stop as I did not know if they had seen Corporal Waldon take his position.

I heard a single shot as I stood approximately 4 feet south of Corporal
Waldon. I saw the suspect fall to the ground. Detective Sears, Detective
Voorhees, Corporal Waldon and I approached the suspect. He was face down in
the middle section of railroad tracks.

Once I got to where the suspect was laying, I gave him commands to show us his hands. He was lying on top of his right hand and would not show it to us. There was a large bloody knife approximately 4 inches away from his left hand. I again ordered him to show us his hand and noted that he was breathing (back was rising and falling) and he was moaning and moving his upper body.

Officer Samano and I grabbed the suspect's legs and pulled him approximately 5 feet away from the knife and handcuffed him. I noticed a small amount of blood on his upper back and lacerations to his wrist. Officer Samano and I pat down the suspect and removed a cell phone, battery and a gray case from his pockets. We then rolled him onto his side (position of recovery). I asked him his name and he looked at me and just moaned. I then asked him his name in Spanish and he moaned again and tried to speak.

The suspects breathing began to get labored. Officer Samano and I rolled 1 him onto his back and began assessing him. I noted that his eyes were fixed in 2 my direction (I was to his right) and his skin color appeared to be getting pale. I 3 began to rub the suspect's sternum and he had no reaction. I noted the suspect 4 was not blinking and it appeared that he may have stopped breathing. I checked 5 for a pulse at his carotid artery and did not feel anything. I told Officer Samano 6 that the suspect was "crashing" and we needed to start CPR. I began doing chest 7 compressions and Officer Samano and I continued switching on chest 8 compressions until the paramedics arrived. 9 10 Once the paramedics arrived, I assisted in loading the suspect onto the 11 gurney and into the ambulance. 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Details:

On 08/30/12, at about 0721 hours, I was dispatched to the area of Joy St/Pearl St regarding a foot pursuit of a suspicious subject who walked off the freeway covered in blood and carrying a knife. Information was also provided that the subject matched the description of a suspect involved in a stabbing in the City of Riverside. While en route to the call Officers advised that this had quickly evolved into an O.I.S. Upon arrival, I parked on Joy St. just north of Pearl St near the east/west train tracks. This was the last direction of travel of the suspect and pursuing Officers. While walking eastbound on the south side of the tracks, I saw a subject watching the incident unfold from behind the north chain link fence line that divides the tracks and the businesses located on Pearl St.

I contacted the subject who identified himself as the same of the said he was an employee at I asked him if he saw anything related to the police activity on the tracks and he said no. If the said that one of the truck drivers told him he witnessed some of the incident. He pointed to the driver (later identified as WT01- who was sitting in the driver's seat of a parked big rig. I called over the driver and he related the following information. If the said that he arrived to the location at 0545 hrs, to drop off a delivery to the listed business. He said that while waiting in his truck (approx 50' from chain link fence) he saw a motorcycle Officer and a blue truck pull (Detective unit) into the parking lot with lights and sirens on.

said the officers ran towards the north fence with their guns out. He said the next thing he saw was a HMA running eastbound along the north side of the tracks. He said the Officers verbally ordered the HMA to stop, but the subject kept running eastbound. Said the HMA was about 50' north of the chain link fence, but he was still able to see that he was carrying what appeared to be a stick (approx 8" long) in his right hand. He said he also saw an Officer running after the HMA along the tracks. Said that the motorcycle officer and the officer in the truck quickly left the parking lot. He said that he walked closer to the chain link fence, but his vision was obstructed by a train. Said that he did not see or hear anything with the train in the way and the loud sirens of the police vehicles. He had no further information at this time. I initially recorded the incident, but was unable to locate the recording on my digital recorder. I later assisted with investigation by searching for evidence and protecting the scene.

On 08/31/12, at about 1600 hours, I called **and a set on the phone and interviewed him again.** is a truck driver and lives in **a set of the interview and later placed the recording on a CD and later placed it into evidence at CPD. Statement was identical to the original statement given on the day of the incident.**

Details:

On 08-30-12 at approximately 0730 hours, I responded to the area of 91 Freeway at Main St reference a suspicious circumstance. I was advised by dispatch that a HMA just got out of a green Rav 4 at the 91 Freeway and 15 Freeway interchange. The Hispanic male was carrying a knife and had blood all over his arms.

It should be noted just prior to this call I received a broadcast that was sent over my MDC from Officer Hubbard reference an assault with a deadly weapon that just occurred in Riverside. The suspect had stabbed a woman and two children and was last seen leaving the scene in either a green Honda CRX or Rav 4.

As I arrived in the area I heard Officer Perez advise that the suspect was just seen in the area of Joy and E. Grand Blvd. Sgt. Butera then advised the suspect was running east bound from Joy St down the railroad tracks towards the freeway overpass. I responded to Radio road and took the dirt road on the north side of the radio tracks, w/b toward the freeway overpass that the suspect was running towards. When I got to the overpass I heard over my unit radio there was an officer involved shooting.

Upon arriving on the scene I observed the suspect was laying on the main railroad track (center track) with his left hand next to a knife which was in front of him. The suspect was facing e/b. Officer M. Samono and Officer L. Shatford grabbed the suspect by his feet and pulled him away from the knife and started searching him.

Sgt Butera asked me to get a camera and photograph the scene in case we are unable to stop trains from coming through and to document where the knife was. See attached disk with photos of the scene. As I was getting the camera, the train that was sitting on the tracks just south of suspect moved forward just past the east side of the over pass and came to a stop.

After photographing the scene I responded to the east side of the overpass and helped secure the scene. Cpl M. Madory responded and handled the crime scene log.

While on the east side of the crime scene I contacted the engineer who stated the following: Stated he was in the locomotive that was the furthest one east. The locomotive was on the track south of the main track (center track) and was west of the over pass. The locomotive was the furthest one east right next to the train cars they were moving.

stated he was on the south side of the locomotive when he observed officers running and vehicles driving up the track through the side view mirror on the north side of the locomotive. Contacted his conductors by radio who, were monitoring the train cars that there were police present on the track. Stated he then went to the left side of the train (north side) and looked out the window. Stated he saw one officer lay down on the main track (center track) in a prone position and fire one shot. said the officer was approximately one train car in front of him (east of officer was shooting at and he never saw the suspect. Stated the only thing he knows is the officer only fired once.

stated after the shooting he moved the train onto the side track to the rear of 1235 Quarry where it was sitting when I contacted him.

The interview was recorded and logged into evidence at the Corona Police Department. A copy of the interview is attached to the report.

I then contacted stated she was monitoring the train movement onto the side track. She was on the north side of the train near the rear of 1235 Quarry St near some covered hopper train cars that had already been moved to side tracks. As she was standing there she was notified by the engineer then heard a loud pop that she recognized as a gunshot and moved to the south side of the train where the other conductor was standing. Stated she never saw the police or the suspect due to there being a bend in the track causing her to be blocked by the train cars that they were moving.

I contacted who is a conductor on the train. He stated he was standing by the switching arm which is located next to the side track on the east side of the overpass. Stated he was on the south side of the train when he was advised by his engineer was on the south side of the police presence on the track. Stated shortly after being advised, approximately 3 seconds, he heard a loud pop which he recognized as a gunshot. Stated he did not know who shot and did not see anything. After the shot he checked on the other conductor show and made sure she was OK.

I then contacted who is a driver for the railroad. I stated he drives the conductors and engineers to their location. I stated he was inside the van that he transports the personnel in and was sitting behind 1235 Quarry St. near the railroad tracks. I stated he had the windows up on the van and his view of the tracks was blocked by the train cars that the engineer and conductors were moving to the side tracks. I stated he was unaware there was a shooting until stated tracks.

During the investigation I contacted the following parties. The statements are summaries and the people were contacted in the order they are mentioned in the report; listen to the audio recordings for further details.

I contacted an employee and at a solution of said he did not see or hear anything today. I said he has been at work since it opened. Said he did not hear any gun shots. Said he did see a Corona PD marked police car pull into their parking lot and then pull out really fast earlier. Said he has not spoken to anyone else about this incident. Said he got to work today at about "630." Said he thinks the incident happened at around 0640 because a police car pulled in the parking in and then out. Said thought the officer was chasing somebody based on the officer's fast driving but did not see other people or anything in particular.

I contacted an employee and a solution of the incident occurred until somebody had mentioned it earlier. Solution is and he did not hear any gunshots or any part of the incident.

I contacted an employee and at said we said he did not see or hear any of the incident. I said he saw a police car come into the parking lot and then do a U-turn and leave. Said he saw the officer do a U-turn about an hour and half prior to us speaking, which would put it at approx. 1000 hours using his time frame. Said the only person he saw was the officer.

I contacted an employee at a said he was out in the back working on one of the trucks. This business is located at the corner of North Joy St. and Grand Blvd. Said he saw some movement and his "neighbor" (unknown name) at the business north of his location said something about "he went this way". Said after the neighbor made this commotion, he paid attention and noticed several police cars coming into the area of Joy St and the rail road tracks. Said he saw one officer running on foot near the railroad tracks at Joy St. said nobody ran through his business in particular and that the neighbor had actually seen the chase. Said he did not see or hear any type of gunshot. I later learned Officer Tran had possibly located this witness/neighbor and the information was later forwarded to Officer L. Larios to contact the witness. NFD

2 On August 30, 2012 at approximately 0721 hours, I was monitoring Corona Police 3 Primary Radio Channel from my office at City Hall when I heard a call of a subject 4 with a knife who was possibly involved in an assault in Riverside. Since I have an 5 unmarked police unit and was down the street from the call, I decided to respond to 6 the area to assist in locating the suspect.

As I was responding, I heard assisting officers over the radio say that they located the suspect in the area of 91 E. Grand Blvd. and that the suspect was running away from the officers. I responded to 105 E. Pearl St., which is a business located on the east side of Pearl 13 St.,. The north fence for 105 Pearl St., borders the railroad tracks. I drove as far east 14 as I could through the parking lot of the business so that I could get ahead of the 15 16 suspect. I saw that Officer Robert Romans was following me into the business on his police motorcycle. I was wearing plain clothes, with my badge being displayed on 17 my belt, next to my duty weapon. I was driving an unmarked Ford F150 that is 18 outfitted with emergency lights and sirens. My lights and sirens were activated as I 19 drove through the business. 20

4 Narrative

On 8/30/2012, about 0759 hours, I responded to assist with an officer involved shooting
investigation. I walked along the train tracks near the scene of the shooting I met with
Detective Craig Taylor at the scene and we responded to businesses in the area of the incident,
or areas where the suspect was believed to have been prior to the incident to acquire video
from surveillance systems.

We first responded to the Metrolink Station at 250 E. Blaine Street, Corona and contacted the security supervisor, Security Supervisor, Security Station Security Street, Corona and contacted the security supervisor, Security Securits Security

We next responded the business center near 91 E. Grand Boulevard. Detective Taylor assisted other police personnel that were canvassing the area and I contacted **19** the president of DSP Electric at 79 E. Grand Boulevard. **19** allowed me to export surveillance video from the surveillance system. I exported video from that same morning between 0515 and 0800 hours. I did not obtain the system date and time from the surveillance system, which displayed the product name Digimerge.

Detective Taylor and I met up and responded to 95 E. Grand Boulevard, where Corporal Ryan 1 Kazsuk was speaking with an employee. The employee advised we could export surveillance 2 video. Note: The initial export of video that day resulted an incorrect time range. Detective 3 Taylor and I responded back to the same business on 9/7/2012, about 1235 hours, to again 4 export the video. We exported video from 8/30/2012 between 0530 and 0830 hours. I checked 5 the surveillance system date and time and it showed 8/30/2012, 1109 hours. My cell phone 6 time showed the same date, but 1110 hours. The surveillance system displayed the product 7 8 name Honeywell. 9 Detective Taylor later advised 91 E. Grand Boulevard did not have exterior video. 10 11 We next responded to 180 N. Joy and contacted and he allowed us to export 12 video from their surveillance system. We exported video from 0600 to 0800 hours the morning 13 of the incident. I checked the surveillance system date and time and it showed 8/30/2012, 1225 14 hours. My cell phone time showed the same date, but 1232 hours. The surveillance system 15 displayed the product name Prodigy. 16 17 We continued to check businesses with a view of the railroad tracks/incident location when we 18 located two witnesses at the city water treatment plant located at 652 E Harrison Street 19 (northwest of the incident). The witnesses were both and both were 20 working at the south end of the property near the railroad tracks. 21 22 On 8/30/2012, about 1357 hours, I first spoke with at the scene. I recorded 23 interview and asked him to start by describing what he saw. The following is a 24 summary of his statement: 25 26

1	said he was at the "primary gallery" assembling a light and he heard yelling.
2	looked up to see what was going on and on the other side of the fence by the train
3	tracks he saw the suspect running with a pipe or stick in his hand.
4	police officer pointing a gun at the suspect and yelling what he described as "hey stop, like get
5	down or something along those lines." said the suspect slowed and looked at him,
6	but continued to run. said, "then I saw all the, the, like, a bunch of cop cars come
7	chasing him." said the suspect ran under the bridge and then he heard a "pop."
8	said additional police vehicles and an ambulance then arrived.
9	
10	I next clarified some of statement and the following is a summary of the
11	clarification.
12	
13	estimated that the incident occurred at or before 0700 hours and he was about 100
14	yards from the train tracks. confirmed that the suspect was running east and had
15	what appeared to be an eighteen inch pipe. said that the motor officer he saw was
16	behind a fence that separated him from the suspect. said that when the suspect
17	continued to run and other officers arrived on scene, "he had some distance on 'em."
18	had described hearing a "pop," so I asked him what he believed it to be. said he
19	believed it was a gunshot and he confirmed he only heard one gunshot. I asked if he
20	could see what was happening, but he could not because of a train and it was dark under the
21	bridge. I asked how long the incident lasted from the point when he first saw the suspect to
22	when he heard a pop. estimated "no more than a couple minutes."
23	
24	I asked if anyone else saw the incident and he directed me to a coworker,
25	. I recorded interview and asked him to start by describing what he saw. The
26	following is a summary of his statement from 8/30/2012, about 1414 hours:
27	

1	said he was down in a pit when yelled to him to "check this out."
2	heard sirens and ran up the stairs to see a motorcycle officer with his gun drawn.
3	described seeing what he described as a "bum" jogging slowly along the tracks.
4	"they were yelling to him to stop, get down, and, but he just kept going." said the officer
5	ran after the suspect along the fence. described seeing a Nissan like mine, but silver (my
6	detective vehicle was a blue Nissan Pathfinder) come up the train tracks.
7	officers that had been running got in the silver Nissan. also saw officers coming from a
8	drainage ditch. said that about thirty seconds later he heard what sounded like one
9	gunshot with an echo.
10	
11	I next clarified parts of statement and the following is a summary of the clarification.
12	
13	confirmed he heard the traffic/motor officer that had the suspect at gunpoint issuing
14	commands to "stop" and possibly "get down." said that the suspect had slowed, but
15	started to run. I asked if he saw the suspect of holding anything, but he said he did not.
16	Detective Taylor asked what the suspect looked like. said a heavier set, like a bum
17	with dirty clothes, and 5'06" to 5'10" tall. Detective Taylor asked to describe the
18	suspect's clothes. said the suspect was possibly wearing jeans and a white shirt that was
19	soiled, dirty. I asked to describe how the shirt was soiled and he said, "It wasn't like black
20	oil or anything, but it was like real dark colored dirt." said it was "patchy, but all over the
21	whole shirt." I asked how long the incident took and he estimate a minute to a minute
22	and a half. I asked why he could not see the incident. said a building, an overpass,
23	and a train were in the way. said it was also dark beneath the overpass. I asked
24	what additional types of emergency vehicles he saw arrive. described seeing unmarked
25	cars with strobe lights and an ambulance a few minutes later. estimated the ambulance
26	arrived three or four minutes after the shooting.
27

DISPATCH SUMMARY:

On Thursday, August 30, 2012, at approximately 7:21 a.m. the Corona Police Department Dispatch received a call of a male subject who had left his green Toyota Rav-4 vehicle on the bridge at the 91 and 15 freeways. The caller stated the windshield was broken and the hood was damaged. The caller told Corona Dispatch the male driver was walking towards the Main St. exit and was wearing a tan t-shirt with black wings on the back and denim blue jeans. The male driver had blood all over him and was carrying a butcher knife in his back pocket, which he was trying to conceal. The caller further described the driver as a Hispanic male adult in his 20's.

During the same time period, Officer Ryan Hubbard (Unit M-2), who happened to be on duty and meeting with an Officer from the Riverside Police Department, wrote and sent an MDT message to the Corona Patrol Officers and Corona Dispatch. Officer Hubbard wrote in his MDT message the description of the same vehicle and suspect and that the subject fit the description of a 245 PC stabbing suspect from the City of Riverside. He wrote the stabbing occurred 15 minutes ago. Corona Dispatch also notified the California Highway Patrol Riverside Station of the above listed information. (RPD Report #12-125850).

Officer Jason Perez (Unit 132) was assigned the initial radio call and Officer Gary Painter (Unit 121) and Cpl. Jason Waldon (Unit 125) were assigned as back up officers. Additional patrol officers and detectives responded to the area of the radio call and assisted with the foot pursuit and containment of Suspect Selvin Rodriguez.

Cpl. Jason Waldon pursued Suspect Selvin Rodriguez on foot from the area of the 91 freeway just east of Main St, through city streets, around businesses to a portion of the railroad tracks that run just beneath the I-15 southbound freeway off-ramp bridge.

At this point, Suspect Rodriguez was still approximately 70-100 yards away from the officers pursuing him. Cpl. Waldon, who was the closest pursuing officer, could see Suspect Rodriguez holding a bloody knife up above his head as he was running. Cpl. Waldon then saw and heard a cargo train sitting on the tracks ahead of Suspect Rodriguez and the engine was running.

During his interview, Cpl. Waldon stated at this point, he had some serious concerns. First, he knew Suspect Rodriguez had just stabbed a female and two children. Secondly, there was a possibility that Suspect Rodriguez could elude capture, due to his distance ahead of pursuing officers. Thirdly, with the train parked and the engine running, there was probably going to be at least a Conductor and possibly someone else in and around the train. Fourthly, Cpl. Waldon knew that there were several transients that hung out or lived in the area Suspect Rodriguez was running. Lastly, Suspect Rodriguez was coming up on another business district where there would be several workers and employees around.

Cpl. Waldon stated based on the above listed concerns, he felt Suspect Rodriguez was a very dangerous threat to the public and to the officers who were pursuing him. He also felt if Suspect Rodriguez was able to elude officers that he would attempt to ambush officers at some point. He felt Suspect Rodriguez was going to seriously hurt or kill someone.

At 7:37 a.m. Cpl. Jason Waldon made the split second decision to stop Suspect Rodriguez before he could hurt someone else. Cpl. Waldon, who had his AR-15 rifle slung over his upper body, got into a prone position on the railroad tracks and with his AR-15 rifle, he shot one round at Suspect Rodriguez. He immediately fell to the ground dropping the knife. Officers caught up with Suspect Rodriguez and handcuffed him and took him into custody. Officers immediately administered first aid to Suspect Rodriguez.

At 7:40 a.m. Officer Leah Shatford, who had just finished conducting a pat-down search of Suspect Rodriguez for additional weapons, noticed his skin was turning pale and it appeared as though he had stopped breathing. She and Officer Megan Samano took turns administering CPR (chest compressions) on Suspect Rodriguez until paramedics arrived.

At 7:44 a.m. Corona Fire Personnel and Paramedics arrived on scene, took over first aid and CPR and transported Suspect Rodriguez to Riverside Community Hospital. Suspect Rodriguez survived the shooting.

INQUIRY OF THE OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTING:

After reviewing the overall incident, reading the officer's reports, looking at the photographs of the scene and evidence and listening to the recorded officer and witness interviews, it was determined that Cpl. Jason Waldon performed his duty and used reasonable force necessary to effect the arrest, to prevent the escape and to overcome the resistance that Suspect Rodriguez was using.

Cpl. Jason Waldon believed that Suspect Rodriguez was a danger to himself, other officers and the general public. Based on his training and experience and several years of being on the SWAT Team, Cpl. Jason Waldon took it upon himself to neutralize and stop Suspect Selvin Rodriguez by shooting him. The result of my inquiry is that Cpl. Jason Waldon used the needed and required amount of force, which was reasonable and necessary in this incident. Cpl. Jason Waldon's actions were within department policy.

DISPOSITION:

This report will be submitted as the Corona Police Department's Administrative Investigation Report. This report will be used by the Use of Force Review Board, who would determine if the shooting was within policy or out of policy. Once the board has reached its specific finding, the Training Sergeant may convene a separate training committee to address training needs and to make recommendations for this department without specific reference to the facts of the incident considered by the board.
